Visitors can compare these approaches with Stanley Spencer's celebrated wall-paintings of World War I in Sandham Memorial Chapel, a National Trust property.

## **NOTES TO EDITORS**

James Dunnett is a Cambridge-trained architect who was also a member of Anthony Caro's Advanced Sculpture Course at St Martin's in the 1970s. He later worked for the celebrated architect Erno Goldfinger RA. He has written art reviews for Art Monthly, Architects' Journal, Architectural Review, 3rd Dimension and other journals and translated Le Corbusier's book 'The Decorative Art of Today' (1925), from which the title of the proposed exhibition is derived.

Robert Fitzmaurice is a full-time artist who has lived in Reading since 1984. Originally from Coventry he studied Fine Art at Sunderland and Reading Universities. Recent exhibitions in West Berkshire include 'Soldier' at Sandham Memorial Chapel (2018) and 'No Eden' at Greenham Control Tower (2019). In 2021 he curated the group exhibition 'Absent Authors' at APT Gallery, London and presented his solo exhibition 'Relations, Stories, Magic' at Nuneaton Museum and Art Gallery.
